Lack of Remembrance & Recognition

Many Americans killed-in-action are inaccurately listed as Canadian or UK citizens.

Over 110 Americans were killed in action while flying Canadian aircraft.

Although they had technically transferred to the USAAF, they perished before the USAAF mobilized in England.

Many RCAF-Americans did not receive any military benefits from the U.S. or Canada.

TOM WITHERS (Richmond, Virginia)
wrote letters to his family about
WHY he joined the RCAF to fight for freedom.
Withers, an Air Gunner on a RCAF Halifax of 405 Squadron
was killed in action on July 27, 1942.

To his Mother on Nov 20, 1941 from England:

"I hope you do not worry about me and Henry too much. We are doing the only possible thing that we can do - the thing we should do. We are both, I believe, satisfied. You and Dad have made our lives full ones by the very freedom that we have been taught to use in enjoying life. Now we have a more serious job to do, that of preserving this freedom."

About 25 % of the pilots comprising the legendary RAF Eagle Squadrons were trained by Canada and wore RCAF wings.
